STRATEGY STATEMENT

As a hospital school we are used to providing our pupils with the personalised learning needed to enable them to catch up on missed schooling and to help them to re-engage with education. However, the pandemic has meant that many of our pupils have missed out on significantly more schooling than usual and they have been subject to increased levels of stress and anxiety.

Our Catch-up Premium Strategy aims to:

- Equip staff with the skills, equipment and resources to deliver remote learning where face to face teaching is not an option due to NHS restrictions on site
- Re-engage pupils with an enthusiasm for learning
- Raise the attainment of all pupils to close the gap created by COVID-19 school closures

• Support pupil and staff well-being

BARRIERS TO FUTURE ATTAINMENT		
1	Increased anxiety about daily life for staff, pupils and their families. Many pupils have been isolated from family and friends for very long periods due to their vulnerable medical condition and restriction on visitors.	
2	Missed schooling due to 1 st lockdown and subsequent quarantine periods	
3	Break from usual routines has caused many pupils to disengage with education. This has impacted particularly SEND pupils	
4	Much of the teaching in 2020/21 may need to be delivered remotely. It can be harder to engage pupils without face-to-face contact. It is also hard to recreate the practical learning environment particularly for those with medical needs
